From the North: From I-95 S, take exit 67 to merge onto SR-150 N. Follow this for 4 miles. Take the exit onto SR-10 East, Iron Bridge Rd towards Chesterfield. In 5.1 miles, turn left onto Courthouse Road. In 1.2 miles you will turn right into the fairgrounds.

From the South: From I-95 N, take exit 62 to merge onto SR-288 N toward Chesterfield, Powhite Pkwy. In 6.7 miles take the exit onto SR-10 East, Iron Bridge Rd towards Chesterfield. In 5.1 miles, turn left onto Courthouse Road. In 1.2 miles you will turn right into the fairgrounds.

Camping (On-Site)

Camping spaces are available with full hookups (please bring an extension cord to connect as sites share an outlet) at the rate of \$35.00/night. Camping will be on a first come, first served basis with paid trial entries. A signed and completed campsite registration form must be filled out when you check in. Complete the campsite form located at the end of the flyer. **The fairgrounds do not allow any open alcoholic beverages.**

Please be sure to put your drink in an unmarked container (bring your Solo cups!). If a county official sees an open alcoholic container, you will be asked to leave. They are very strict about this.

GENERAL RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All sanctioned classes are open to Jack Russell Terriers only.
2. Exhibitors and owners of terriers entered must be current JRTCA members and must not be a member of a conflicting JRT organization or register their JRTs in any all-breed registry or conflicting JRT organization. If an exhibitor is found to be in violation of this policy, entry will be disqualified and no refunds will be given. If a violation is confirmed after the trial, placements will be voided from all JRTCA records. Exhibitors must submit a completed entry form including a signed waiver for every trial they enter.
3. Entries MUST be within the 10-15" JRTCA height standard for all sanctioned classes (with the exception of pups who have not yet met the 10" height standard); measuring devices will be available on the trial grounds.
4. Puppies (under 12 months) are not eligible for championship in any division but their own. Puppies are eligible to compete only if they have reached their four-month birthday (not 16 weeks). A puppy's age is the actual age the pup is on the day of the trial.
5. Bitches in season may not compete in any division. Pre-entry fees of bitches in season will be refunded with a veterinarian certificate, or as otherwise agreed upon by the Trial Chairperson.
6. Spayed or neutered terriers may compete in Working and Miscellaneous Conformation. They may not compete in Puppy, Family* or Open Conformation. *Note: For Family Classes, Brood Bitches and Stud Dogs entered may not be spayed/neutered. The offspring at their sides may be intact or spayed/neutered.
7. A terrier bred by a sanctioned JRTCA Judge may not be shown under that Judge in the conformation division.
8. Terriers owned or co-owned by the Trial Chairperson, or any member of their household, may not be entered in any phase of the competition, with the exception of Child and Youth Handling.
9. Terriers owned by judges may not be entered in the division in which they are judging, but may enter the competition in any other division.
10. Terriers owned by stewards may be entered in any division provided that they find a substitute to perform their duties or have someone else show their terriers.
11. Requests for the measurement of a terrier entered in any class number may be made only by another exhibitor in that same class number or by the Judge EXCEPT in Racing. Requests for the measurement of a terrier in Racing may be made by the Judge or by an exhibitor with a terrier entered in the same class number; OR, if classes are split by gender, may call for the measurement of a terrier of the opposite gender in the same age and height category. (Example: The owner of an under adult dog entered in Racing may call for the measurement of an under adult bitch as the potential exists for them to race each other in the Championship Races.) Exhibitors racing puppies may call for the measurement of a puppy in a different age category as long as it is in the same height category. The person making the request for measurement must name the terrier or terriers they wish to have measured, but requests for measurement of entire classes will not be honored. The measurement of the terrier will be considered the terrier's official height for the duration of the trial. Only JRTCA height cards issued after September, 1999 will be honored.

12. Excessive use of squeaky or fur-like baiting devices by exhibitors is prohibited in the Conformation ring and may result in the exhibitor being excused from the class. "Excessive use" will be at Judge's discretion.
13. Exhibitors participating in the JRTCA Working Terrier classes or Certificate Go-To-Ground must submit the appropriate JRTCA certificates with pre-entries or at the time of post-entry. The Judge may require a copy of the certificate be presented to the Ring/Den steward at time of judging. Registered terriers may submit a copy of NHC application signed by a JRTCA Working Judge within 30 days of the date it was issued.
14. Puppies under the age of three months are not permitted on the trial grounds. Any person violating this rule will be excused from all classes entered, and asked to leave the trial site.
15. All dogs must be leashed or crated except when competition requires off-leash work. No liberty leashes allowed.
16. Overly aggressive dogs, or an owner's failure to control their dog, may result in disqualification at the discretion of the Judges or the Trial Chairperson.
17. The abuse or severe disciplining of dogs on the trial grounds is prohibited. Anyone displaying such behavior will be asked to leave the trial site, and no entry fees will be refunded.
18. Dogs other than JRTs on the grounds may be excluded or permitted at the discretion of the Trial Chairperson.
19. Exhibitors are responsible to double check the classes they have entered and be on time. No refunds will be given for missed classes.
20. The owner/handler of a terrier entering any class does so at his/her own risk and agrees to abide by the rules of the JRTCA and the trial. A copy of the JRTCA Rule Book can be obtained by contacting the JRTCA office (410-561-3655) or it can be downloaded from the JRTCA website (www.terrier.com).
21. Unsportsmanlike conduct, or the use of foul and abusive language, will not be tolerated. Anyone demonstrating such conduct will be asked to leave the trial site and no entry fees will be refunded. In addition, such conduct will be subject to penalties which may include the suspension of membership, restriction from entering the JRTCA National Trial, and/or fines. Trial Chairpersons have the right to refuse any entry at their sole and absolute discretion.
22. All dogs brought to JRTCA sanctioned trials must be current on vaccinations. No dogs of any age may be brought to a trial who have suspicion of contagious or infectious disease.
23. Judges may not eat, smoke, vape, or use cell phones while at their events.
24. Shock collars are not allowed while competing in sanctioned trial events.
25. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL IN ALL DIVISIONS.

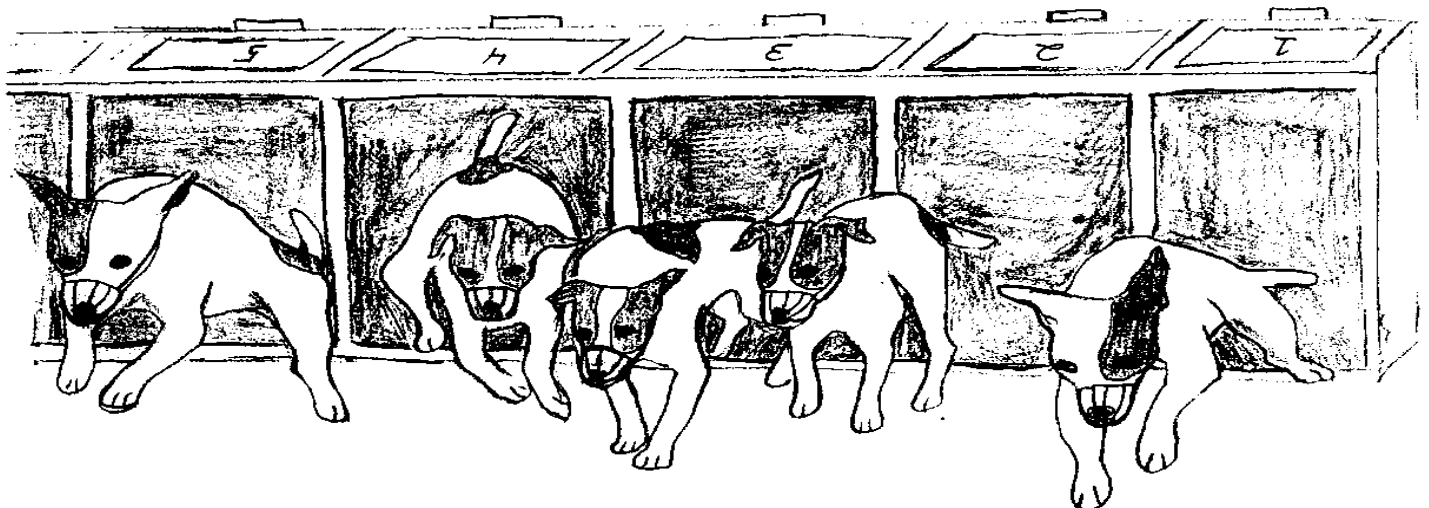
- We will be hosting a “ticket in the bag” style raffle. Raffle prizes will be set up on tables with a “ticket bag” attached to each prize.

DIVISION A - RACING

All terriers must be muzzled. Plastic muzzles or close-ended cloth muzzles only. Black, brown clear or white muzzles are acceptable; NO figure eight or open-ended muzzles will be allowed.

Qualifications for Championship Run Offs

- A. Terrier must place first in a flat or hurdle race final to qualify for championship run offs. First to the hole is not necessarily first through the backside of the barrier.
- B. A terrier **MUST ENTER AND FINISH** in both, at least one flat race AND one hurdle race at the beginning level based on trial entries (heat, semi, final).
- C. A terrier must continue to advance, if qualified, to all additional semi-final heats up to the final championship race. If injured, the terrier is then finished and cannot race in the final.
- D. A **FINISHED** race is when the terrier runs down the track unassisted (by owner or anyone else) with a secured muzzle to the backside of the barrier.
- E. In the event a terrier does not meet all the above criteria, the second-place terrier in the final of that class (either flats or hurdles) will qualify for the championship run off if they meet the criteria as outlined above.

Section 1: Flat Races

- Class 1 - Pups: 6 up to 9 months, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 2 - Pups: 6 up to 9 months, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 3 - Pups: 9 up to 12 months, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 4 - Pups: 9 up to 12 months, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 5 - Senior: Dogs 9 years and older, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 6 - Senior: Dogs 9 years and older, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 7 - Senior: Bitches 9 years and older, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 8 - Senior: Bitches 9 years and older, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 9 - Dogs: 1 year and older, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 10 - Dogs: 1 year and older, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 11 - Bitches: 1 year and older, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 12 - Bitches: 1 year and older, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 13 - Veteran Dogs, 6 years and older, 10" up to 12½"
- Class 14 - Veteran Dogs, 6 years and older, over 12½" up to 15"
- Class 15 - Veteran Bitches, 6 years and older, 10" up to 12½"

 Class 33 - Veteran Dogs: 6 years and older, 10" up to 12½"
 Class 34 - Veteran Dogs: 6 years and older, over 12½" up to 15"
 Class 35 - Veteran Bitches: 6 and older 10" up to 12 1/2"
 Class 36 - Veteran Bitches: 6 years and older, over 12½" up to 15"

Section 3: Championship Run-Offs

No entry fee required. Adult and Veteran run-offs immediately following Class 36.

Class 37 - **Adult Championship 10" up to 12½"**, Open to 1st place winners of classes 9,11,29,31
 Class 38 - **Adult Championship Over 12½" up to 15"**, Open to 1st place winners of classes 10,12,30,32
 Class 39 - **Veteran Championship 10" up to 12½"**, Open to 1st place winners of classes 13,15,33,35
 Class 40 - **Veteran Championship Over 12½" up to 15"**, Open to 1st place winners of classes 14,16,34,36

DIVISION B - YOUTH

Section 1: Youth

- Child Handlers 5-9 years of age. They must handle a six month or older Jack Russell terrier.
- Youth Handlers: 10-16 years of age. The youth handler must handle the same adult terrier in all Youth Division classes entered. No puppies please. See rules for exceptions regarding injured terriers.
- Child/Youth exhibitor's age is determined as of January 1st of the current calendar year; except for those children turning 5 years of age. They may start competing in Child Handler at any time of the year following their 5th birthday.
- Child/Youth entries must be JRTCA members either under a family membership or under an individual Youth membership.
- Please list class number, child/youth's name, birthday, and dog's name on entry form.
- The quality of the dog is NOT to be considered.
- Points are 1st=8 pts., 2nd=6 pts., 3rd=5 pts., 4th= 4 pts., 5th=3 pts., 6th= 2 pts., & Participation=1 pt.

Class 41 - Child Handler. Open to any youth aged 5 through 9, handling a Jack Russell Terrier, six months of age or older. This class is offered as an introductory experience in handling and learning about the Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on child's ability to present his/her dog and beginning knowledge of the Jack Russell. Quality of the dog NOT to be considered.

Class 42 - Youth Handler. Open to any youth aged 10 through 16, handling an adult Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on the youth's ability to present his/her dog and knowledge of the Jack Russell Terrier. Quality of the dog NOT to be considered.

Class 43 - Youth Working Judge's Choice. Open to any youth handler aged 10-16 handling an adult JRT. Judged on the youth's knowledge of hunting and the working terrier and ability to answer questions presented by a JRTCA Working Judge; no terrier to accompany handler in class.

Class 44 - Youth Go-to-Ground. Open to any youth aged 10 through 16 handling an adult JRT. Judged on the youth's ability to present his/her dog and knowledge of Go-to-Ground. To be run through the 10-foot Novice liner; time not to be considered.

Class 45 - YOUTH Handler High Score and Reserve

Awarded to the highest scoring youth and runner-up in classes 42, 43, and 44.

DIVISION C - CONFORMATION

- Cross entering is not permitted within or between the Open and Working sections.
- Exhibitors participating in the working classes must submit the appropriate JRTCA paperwork with entries. The judge may require a copy of the National Hunting Certificate to be presented to the ring steward at the time of judging.
- Registered terriers may submit a copy of the NHC application signed by a JRTCA working judge, within 30 days of the date it was issued.

Class 46 - 3 up to 4 month old Pups (Non-Sanctioned)

4 UP TO 6 MONTH PUPPY CONFORMATION

Class 47 - Dog Pups, 4 up to 6 months.

Class 48 - Bitch Pups, 4 up to 6 months.

Class 49 - **BEST 4 UP TO 6 MONTH PUPPY & RESERVE** – Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of classes 47 & 48

6 UP TO 12 MONTH PUPPY CONFORMATION

Class 50 - Dog Pups, 6 up to 9 months

Class 51 - Dog Pups, 9 up to 12 months

Class 52 - **BEST 6 UP TO 12 PUPPY DOG AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of classes 50 & 51.

Class 53 - Bitch Pups, 6 up to 9 months.

Class 54 - Bitch Pups, 9 up to 12 months.

Class 55 - **BEST 6 UP TO 12 PUPPY BITCH AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of classes 53 & 54.

Class 56 - **PUPPY CONFORMATION CHAMPION AND RESERVE** – Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of classes 52 & 55

Section 2: FAMILY - Judged on the Breed Standard and consistency of type.

Class 57: Stud Dog and Get - Open to sire with at least two, but not more than three offspring at a parent's side. Stud dog must be an intact male. Offspring may be intact or spayed/neutered.

Class 58: Brood Bitch and Produce - Open to dam with at least two, but not more than three offspring at a parent's side. Brood Bitch must be an intact female. Offspring may be intact or spayed/neutered.

Class 59: **BEST FAMILY AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd places from classes 57 and 58. No entry fee.

Section 3: MISCELLANEOUS

Open to any adult JRT including those spayed and neutered. Judged on breed standard unless otherwise noted.

Class 60: Spayed/Neutered Adult. Open to any spayed/neutered adult.

Class 61: Virginia Bred. Open to any adult Jack Russell bred in the state of Virginia.

Class 62: Companion. Open to all JRTS. Judged on companionship, cuteness, personality, obedience, and tricks. Not to be judged on breed standard, (Non-Sanctioned).

JUNIOR TERRIERS – Open to any adult Jack Russell Terrier age 12 months to 24 months, including those who have been spayed or neutered. Judged on breed standard.(Non-Sanctioned)

Class 63: Junior Dogs. Open to any 12 up to 24 month JRT dog (Non-Sanctioned).

Class 64: Junior Bitches Open to any 12 up to 24 month JRT bitch (Non-Sanctioned).

Class 65: **BEST JUNIOR AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd places from classes 63 and 64. No entry fee.

SUITABILITY *The dog the judge would choose to take hunting to each quarry listed below.*

Class 66 - Suitability to Red Fox.

Class 67 - Suitability to Groundhog

Class 68 - Suitability to Raccoon/Badger

Section 4: JRTCA WORKING TERRIER CONFORMATION

Open to any JRTCA registered terrier owned by a JRTCA member who holds a JRTCA Natural Hunting Certificate. Terriers entering the Working Section **may not** cross-enter into the Open Section; no cross-entering is permitted within the Working Section.

Class 69 - Bronze Medallion Dog. Open to any dog which has earned the JRTCA Bronze Medallion for Special Merit in the field.

Class 70 - Bred by Exhibitor Working Terrier Dog. Open to any Working Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor under whose kennel prefix the terrier is registered; must be handled by the breeder or a member of the breeder's immediate family.

Class 71 - Working Terrier Dog, 10" up to 12½"

Class 72 - Working Terrier Dog, over 12½" up to 15"

Class 73 - Working Veteran Terrier Dog, 10" up to 12½"

Class 74 - Working Veteran Terrier Dog, over 12½" up to 15"

Class 75 - Neutered Working Terrier Dog. Open to any adult Neutered Jack Russell Terrier, which holds a JRTCA Natural Hunting Certificate.

Class 76 - **BEST WORKING TERRIER DOG AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Working Terrier Dog classes.

Class 77 - Bronze Medallion Bitch. Open to any bitch which has earned the JRTCA Bronze Medallion for Special Merit in the field.

Class 78 - Bred by Exhibitor Working Terrier Bitch. Open to any Working Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor *under whose kennel prefix is registered*; must be handled by the breeder or a member of the breeder's immediate family.

Class 79 - Working Terrier Bitch, 10" up to 12½"

Class 80 - Working Terrier Bitch, over 12½" up to 15"

Class 81 - Working Veteran Terrier Bitch, 10" up to 12½"

Class 82 - Working Veteran Terrier Bitch, over 12½" up to 15"

Class 83 - Spayed Working Terrier Bitch. Open to any adult Spayed Jack Russell Terrier, which holds a JRTCA Natural Hunting Certificate.

Class 84 - **BEST WORKING TERRIER BITCH AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Working Terrier Bitch classes.

Class 85 - **BEST WORKING TERRIER CONFORMATION CHAMPION AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Best Working Terrier Dog and Reserve and Best Working Terrier Bitch and Reserve.

Section 5: OPEN ADULT CONFORMATION

Class 86 - Bred by Exhibitor Dog. Open to any adult Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor; must be handled by the breeder *under shown kennel prefix the terrier is registered* or a member of the breeder's immediate family.

Class 87 - Dogs 1 year and older 10" up to 12½" smooth

Class 88 - Dogs 1 year and older 10" up to 12½" rough/broken

Class 89 - Dogs 1 year and older, over 12½" up to 15" smooth

Class 90 - Dogs 1 year and older, over 12½" up to 15" rough/broken

Class 91 - **BEST OPEN DOG AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Open Dog classes.

- Class 92 - Bred by Exhibitor Bitch. Open to any adult Jack Russell Terrier owned and bred by the exhibitor; must be handled by the breeder under whose kennel prefix the terrier is registered or a member of the breeder's immediate family.
- Class 93 - Bitches 1 year and older, 10" up to 12½", smooth
- Class 94 - Bitches 1 year and older, 10" up to 12½", rough/broken
- Class 95 - Bitches 1 year and older, over 12½" up to 15", smooth
- Class 96 - Bitches 1 year and older, over 12½" up to 15", rough/broken
- Class 97 - **BEST OPEN BITCH AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of Open Bitch classes.
- Class 98 - **BEST OPEN TERRIER AND RESERVE** - Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of classes 88 & 94

DIVISION C – GO TO GROUND

A timed event that simulates the terrier's natural instinct to hunt. The terrier enters an artificial den/tunnel to demonstrate its working ability. Schooling prior to the competition is not permitted. Terrier may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying.) For Championship Certificate classes, a copy of the certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of the class. No cross entering between Certificate classes.

Timing is as follows:

Novice Puppy & Novice Adult - One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry for 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Open Puppy & Open Adult - One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter once until quarry is reached; must work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Puppy Championship - One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter once until quarry is reached; work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Championship Certificate Classes - One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave the earth; work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry.

Class 99 - Pre-Novice Puppy

Open to Jack Russell puppies 4 up to 6 months. Entry in Pre- Novice Puppy class does not affect the puppy's eligibility to enter the Novice Class after 6 months of age. (One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter until quarry is reached; mark quarry for 15 seconds without a break in work and without leaving quarry.)

Class 100 - Novice Puppy

Open to JRTs 6 up to 12 months which have not scored a 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Open Puppy Class at this trial.

Class 101 - Open Puppy

Open to Jack Russells 6 up to 12 months which have scored a 100% in a Novice Go-to-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. Not open to any puppy which has competed in Puppy Championship GTG. Puppies earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Puppy Championship GTG class at this trial or may continue competing in Open Puppy GTG class at future trials.

Class 102 - Novice Adult

Open to Jack Russells one year of age or older which have not scored 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial may upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Open class at this trial

Class 103 - Open Adult

Open to Jack Russells one year or older which have scored 100% in a Novice Go-to-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. May continue to compete in Open Adult class until they apply for a receive their Trial Certificate. A terrier achieving 100% in the Open Adult Class is eligible to apply for a Trial Certificate if the terrier is registered or recorded with the JRTCA.

Class 104 - Puppy Championship

Open to Jack Russells 6 up to 12 months which have earned 100% in an Open Go-to-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. A copy of a 100% Open score sheet shall be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of class. First and second place winners will be Puppy Go-to-Ground Champion and Reserve. Once a puppy competes in Puppy Championship GTG, they cannot return to open.

Certificate Classes – Open to any adult Jack Russell one year and over, which holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. A copy of the certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of the class. First and second place winners will be Go-To-Ground Champion and Reserve. For Certificate Classes: Time to reach quarry: 1 second per foot of tunnel. Mark quarry for: one (1) minute. May not leave the earth.

Class 105 - Adult Championship Certificate 10" up to 12½", 1 year and older

Class 106 - Adult Championship Certificate 12½" up to 15", 1 year and older

Class 107 - Veteran Championship Certificate: 10" up to 12½", 6 years and older

Class 108 - Veteran Championship Certificate 12½" up to 15", 6 years and older

Class 109 - Senior Championship Certificate: 10" up to 12½", 9 years and older

Class 110 - Senior Championship Certificate 12½" up to 15", 9 years and older

DIVISION D – SUPER-EARTH

A challenging GTG course with a series of false entrances and/or false tunnels and dens. Open to any Jack Russell Terrier, 6 months and older. Schooling prior to the competition is not permitted. The Terrier may switch from one type of work to another (examples: baying to concentrated stare or digging to baying.)

Timing for all Super Earth Classes: One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave and re- enter the earth multiple times until quarry is reached; work quarry for one minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry. Terrier is not to leave quarry once it is reached. Classes may be combined as entries warrant.

Class 111 – 6 up to 12 month Open Puppy Super Earth

Puppies earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Puppy Championship Super Earth class at this trial OR may continue competing in Open Puppy Super Earth class at future trials. Open Puppy Super Earth is not open to any Puppy which has competed in Puppy Championship Super Earth.

Class 112 - Open Adult Super Earth 10" up to 12½" - Open to Jack Russells, one year and older.

Class 113 - Open Adult Super Earth Over 12½" up to 15" - Open to Jack Russells, one year and older.

Class 114 - Open Veteran Super Earth 10" up to 12½" - Open to Jack Russells, six years and older.

Class 115 - Open Veteran Super Earth Over 12½" up to 15" - Open to Jack Russells, six years and older.

Class 116 – 6 up to 12 month Puppy Championship Super Earth

Certificate Classes: Open to any adult JRT, one (1) year and over, which holds a JRTCA Super Earth Trial Certificate. A copy of the Certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or be shown to the Den Steward at the time of the class. First and second place winners will be Super Earth Champion and Reserve. No cross entering between Certificate Classes.

Class 117 - Adult Championship Certificate Super Earth 10" up to 12½", 1 year and older

Class 118 - Adult Championship Certificate Super Earth Over 12½" up to 15", 1 year and older

Class 119 - Veteran Championship Certificate Super Earth 10" up to 12½", 6 years and older

Class 120 - Veteran Championship Certificate Super Earth 12½ to 15", 6 years and older

Class 121 - Senior Championship Certificate Super Earth 10" up to 12½", 9 years and older

Class 122 - Senior Championship Certificate Super Earth 12½ to 15", 9 years and older

DIVISION E – TRAILING AND LOCATING

The terrier is judged on his ability to follow a line in a simulated natural hunting environment, to locate, mark and open on the quarry. The terrier is judged on a combination of time and accuracy.

- The handler must remain at the starting area.
- No directional hand signals allowed.
- The handler may use verbal commands to praise or recall the terrier.
- The length of the course is a minimum of 50 steps with at least two, but not more than four, changes in direction.
- The trail is scented before the competition, at least 30 minutes prior to the competition for the scent to dry to the vegetation and the ground. The preferable scent is a mixture of rat urine, water and unscented glycerin. Use fox urine only if a fox is the quarry.
- No schooling is permitted in area prior to the competition starting.
- Flags are not to be used to mark the course.
- The terrier is judged on his ability to follow a line in a simulated natural hunting environment, to locate, mark and open on the quarry.
- The terrier is judged on a combination of time and accuracy. The terrier with the fastest time is not necessarily the winner.
- The starting point is a natural marked spot indicated by the Judge.
- The end is a natural marked spot approximately 2-3 feet from the actual quarry. The terrier's time is clocked up until he comes to this spot. This is considered coming up to the quarry for this test.

Additions of 1-15 seconds are taken for the following:

Backtracking: Runs back over the line/scented trail.

Overrunning: Overruns the line at a sharp turn; the harder the drive, the more the correction has to be made.

Weaving: Runs from side to side of the line.

Swinging: Races in wide circles in hit or miss fashion. Does not follow line directly. Skirts cover, sloppy work.

Pottering/Loafing: Mucking about on line, goes over line again. Makes check/ change of direction where none exists. Lacks animation. Swings off line at start of check, then waits for someone to find line. Pees on bushes, pokes in holes, wastes time.

Babbling: Opens/barks inappropriately off the line or on other game.

Quitting: Should be taken off trail and disqualified. • Handler Error: Misleads or distracts terrier. Does not follow orders/rules.

Switching Quarry: Dog swings off line completely. Dog runs other quarry/trail.

Deductions of 1-15 points are taken for the following:

Marking Quarry: Should come up to quarry: points off for not going the whole way.

BONUS: 10 seconds off time if dog opens on quarry.

Class 123 - Puppies: 6 up to 12 months: 10" up to 15"

Class 124 - Adults: 1 year & older: 10" up to 15"

Class 125 - Veterans: 6 years & older: 10" up to 15"

Class 126 - Seniors: 9 years & older: 10" up to 15"

Class 127 - Trailing & Locating High Score and Reserve

DIVISION F – LURE COURSING (NON-SANCTIONED)

Class 128 - Puppies 6 up to 9 months

Class 129 - Puppies 9 up to 12 months

Class 130 - Adults, 10" up to 12 ½"

Class 131 - Adults, over 12 ½" up to 15"

Class 132 - Veterans, 10" up to 12 ½", Open to terriers 6 years and older

Class 133 - Veterans, over 12 ½" up to 15", Open to terriers 6 years and older

Class 134 - Seniors, 10" up to 12 ½", Open to terriers 9 years and older

Class 135 - Seniors, over 12 ½" up to 15", Open to terriers 9 years and older

Class 136 – High Score Lure Coursing Under and Reserve

Class 137 – High Score Lure Coursing Over and Reserve

DIVISION G – BRUSH HUNT (NON-SANCTIONED)

Can your terrier find the quarry? Your dog will be timed from release in a natural but fenced-in area where there will be a quarry protected by a cage yet hidden in the area.

- Time starts when the handler releases the terrier in locating the quarry. After one minute, handler may assist the terrier in locating the quarry.
- **JUDGE** determines when the terrier locates and/or works the quarry

Class 138 - Puppies: 6 up to 12 months

Class 139 - Adults: Over one year of age

Class 140 - Veterans: 6 years and older

Class 141 - Seniors: 9 years and older

Class 142 – High Score Brush Hunt - 1st and 2nd fastest times of the day

DIVISION H – THUNDER TUNNEL (NON-SANCTIONED)

This is a timed event/competition with the terrier working its way through a tunnel maze that may have dead ends and obstacles to maneuver. The tunnel has a clear side so you can see the progress of your terrier as it makes its way to the caged quarry. The terrier runs the tunnel twice; the best time is the final time that counts towards placement.

Class 143 - Puppies: 6 months up to 12 months

Class 144 - Adults 10" up to 12 ½"

Class 145 - Adults over 12 ½" up to 15"

Class 146 - Veterans 6 years and older, 10" up to 15"

Class 147 - Seniors 9 years and older, 10" up to 15"

Class 148 – High Score Thunder Tunnel and Reserve 1st and 2nd fastest times of the day.

DIVISION I – NOSEWORK

LEVEL 1 Containers and Level 2 Containers will be on Saturday ONLY (Class 149-150)

LEVEL 1 Exterior and Level 2 Exterior will be Sunday ONLY (Class 152-153)

Class 149: Level 1 Containers – 8 to 10 identical containers. 1 birch hide, 1 incorrect call allowed. Time allowed 2:00 min. Team must go through start markers to start time.” Alert” is called when hide is found. Faults will be assessed for dropped food, incorrect calls, not passing through start markers. NQ for fouling the ring or going overtime. Placements for fastest time with no faults first. On lead

Class 150: Level 2 Containers There are 2 hides, can be either Birch, Anise or Clove. In Interior or Exterior hide can be 2 feet high. Containers can be 10 or 12 white boxes or any other container. Time limit can be 2:30 sec. or more - judge’s decision

Class 151: Champion & Reserve for combined scores from 2 classes

SUNDAY

Class 152: Level 1 Exterior - 1 birch hide, no higher than 12” on any object, search area is approx. 10 x 20ft. 1 incorrect call is allowed. Must go through start markers. Time allowed is the judge’s decision. It can be 2:30 sec. Placement is fastest time without faults. Can be done on or off lead.

Class 153: Level 2 Exterior- There are 2 hides, can be either Birch, Anise or Clove. In Interior or Exterior hide can be 2 feet high. Containers can be 10 or 12 white boxes or any other container. Time limit can be 2:30 sec. or more - judge’s decision

Class 154: Champion & Reserve for combined scores from 2 classes

CHESTERFIELD COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS RENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES AND FIREARMS.** Alcoholic beverages, illegal substances shall **NOT** be brought or consumed on park properties. No illegal possession of weapons is allowed on Chesterfield County Park Property. Any person believed to be intoxicated, under the influence of illegal substances or illegally possessing a weapon shall be excluded from the property.
2. **An off-duty Chesterfield County Police Officer will be required for any event for youth between 14-20 paid directly by the applicant will be required for all facility uses for participants 12-18 years of age. In addition, there must be one adult chaperone for every fifteen participants. If deemed necessary, an additional staff will be required and an additional fee charged to the applicant.**
3. Any false information on the fairground rental application is cause for immediate end of use and the applicant and their guests must leave the premises immediately.
4. If the police are called as the result of any misconduct of the applicant or their guests the rental will end immediately and the applicant and all their guests shall be required to leave the premises immediately.
5. **ATTENDANCE BY A RESPONSIBLE PERSON.** A responsible person shall be at all functions held within park facilities. Such a person shall work cooperatively with park personnel to insure proper care of property and enforcement of park regulations. Applicant accepts responsibility for any damages that might occur during the period of use. The applicant agrees to save the County harmless from all claims for injuries of persons incurred while using the department facilities.
6. **CROWD LIMITATION.** Attendance shall be limited to the number stated on the fairground rental application. The applicant shall be directly responsible to the Fire Prevention Bureau for infractions.
7. **GROUND AND PROPERTY.** County property shall not be moved or removed from premises. The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to inspect the premises during any activity. Supplies provided for rentals include **tables and chairs** only. Any user leaving the facility unattended will be held responsible for any damage or theft that occurs. The user shall not modify or change the heating or cooling in effect during the building use.
8. **GROUP RESPONSIBILITIES.** The organization/individual using the facility shall be responsible for the proper conduct of persons in attendance and the care and cleanup of property which includes taking down all tables and chairs, putting them in storage and sweeping the floor. An adult must closely supervise all children. Fairgrounds usage shall be limited to the area(s) reserved by the group/individual.
9. **SIGNAGE/DECORATIONS OR STAGING.** Signage/decorations must be installed and removed so as not to deface or damage any park/building property. User **MUST** remove all signage/decorations before leaving the premises. Special equipment, such as lights, amplifiers, tents, mechanical rides, etc. is not permitted without a Special Events Permit. Balloons must be secured to a stationary object at all times, while inside the facility.
10. **PARKING.** Parking of vehicles on park grounds shall be confined to approved areas and users shall adhere to all traffic regulations in effect at that park. **Please do not park in front of maintenance roads or trails.**
11. **PETS.** Animals needed to provide assistance to persons with disabilities will be permitted to enter. Pets must be kept on a leash.
12. **Smoking Policy.** The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Building is a smoke-free facility.
13. **Fees/Charges:** Non-profit groups may conduct fund raising activities. Private and for-profit groups may not charge fees or charges.
14. **Refunds:** Refunds will be granted until two (2) weeks prior to the reservation date and must be requested in writing to the Parks and Staff contact. No refunds will be issued after this time. There will be a \$25 processing fee on all refunds. Refunds will not be granted for inclement weather unless the department closes the facility.
15. **Date Changes:** All requests for date changes must be put in writing and received at the parks and recreation administration office at least two (2) weeks prior to the original reservation date. Date changes are limited to availability.
16. **Outside Facilities.** Any use of the Chesterfield County Fairgrounds may require a special events permit.
17. **Check-Out Policy.** The using organization/individual is responsible for the fairgrounds and its contents during use.
18. **Rental Time:** Your use of the facility is for the exact time you pay to rent. There is no time provided before to set up and no time after provided for cleanup. You must pay to rent the facility for these purposes. The Fairgrounds will only be open during the exact hours for which you have paid to rent the facility.
19. **Extended rental time:** You will only be able to pay to extend your rental time during regular operating hours. Extended hours must be paid for two weeks prior to your rental date.

Chesterfield County Fairgrounds is equipped with campsites to accommodate overnight stays. Use of the campground is included with any reservation of the Fairgrounds.

All individuals camping overnight, whether in a tent or RV, must use marked, designated campsites. Event organizers will be supplied with a Campsite Map that shows a detailed map and description of available campsites. The event organizer (renter) may determine who gets which campsite, but every camper must be in a designated campsite.

The event organizer (renter) is responsible for ensuring all campers complete a Campsite Registration Form (attached). It is the responsibility of the renter to collect these Campsite Registration Forms and provide them to Chesterfield Parks and Recreation Staff. Parks and Recreation Staff will collect forms daily at the Fairgrounds, as needed.

The renter must ensure that all campers abide by the following Campground Rules and Regulations:

- All campers (RV and tent campers) are required to fill out a campground registration form.
- Only persons 18 years or older may register for a campsite. The registrant is responsible for the occupants of the campsite.
- The Event Organizer must collect all campsite registration forms and make copies available to the Parks and Recreation staff.
- Camping is only allowed in marked, designated campsites.
- All camping equipment must be set up within the parameters of campsite.
- Occupancy of each campsite shall be limited to not more than 6 persons or immediate family.
- No visitors shall be allowed between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- Quiet hours shall be from midnight to 7 a.m.
- Restraints are not to be attached to park structures, trees or vegetation. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets and to ensure pets do not disturb other campers.
- Ground fires are not permitted.
- Do not cut or scar any plants or trees.
- Alcohol Beverages are prohibited.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Litter and garbage should be deposited in the trash dumpsters provided or taken out of the campgrounds with you.
- A dump station is provided at Gate 4 for the proper disposal of wastewater.

Event Organizers may impose additional campground rules with the approval of Chesterfield Parks and Recreation.
